HKSAR Government thanks President for making important instructions on

issues raised by HK academicians of Chinese Academy of Sciences and Chinese Academy of Engineering

Chinese President Xi Jinping has made an important instruction in response to a letter written to him by 24 Hong Kong academicians of the Chinese Academy of Sciences and the Chinese Academy of Engineering, expressing concern about cross-boundary remittance of science and technology project funding to Hong Kong. The Ministry of Science and Technology and the Ministry of Finance have promulgated provisions on opening up science and technology funding of the Chinese Government for application by higher education institutions and research institutions in Hong Kong, which include the arrangements on cross-boundary remittance of approved project funding to Hong Kong, with a view to further enhancing the role of the local technology sector in promoting national technological advancement.

The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Government on May 14 welcomes the initiative and is very thankful to President Xi for personally making the instruction which affirms that Hong Kong has a solid technological foundation and a pool of quality scientific and technological talents, and recognises the significant contribution made by Hong Kong's science and technology sector to the development of Hong Kong and the country. The instruction also mentions that the Chinese Government will promote collaboration between Hong Kong and Mainland China on the technology front and support Hong Kong to become an international innovation and technology hub.

CE visits Sichuan

The Chief Executive of HKSAR, Mrs Carrie Lam, led a HKSAR delegation with over 120 members and working staff to visit Sichuan Province from May 11 to 13, 2018 to attend the high-level meeting cum First Plenary of the Hong Kong-Sichuan Co-operation Conference, the Hong Kong-Sichuan Exchange Conference on Investment and Trade Co-operation, and events related to post-earthquake reconstruction support work after the massive Wenchuan earthquake of 2008.

Mrs Lam and the Secretary of the CPC Sichuan Provincial Committee, Mr Peng Qinghua, co-chaired the high-level meeting cum First Plenary of the Hong Kong-Sichuan Co-operation Conference in Chengdu with the attendance of the HKSAR Government members of the delegation. The meeting cum plenary established a new co-operation

mechanism as a platform for the multifaceted co-operation between Hong Kong and Sichuan.

In addition, Mrs Lam and Mr Peng, together with the Director of the Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office of the State Council, Mr Zhang Xiaoming, and the Director of the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR, Mr Wang Zhimin, witnessed the signing of the arrangement for the Hong Kong-Sichuan Co-operation Conference and the memorandum for the High-Level Meeting cum First Plenary of the Hong Kong-Sichuan Co-operation Conference between Sichuan and Hong Kong.

Afterwards, Mrs Lam and all of the delegation members joined the Hong Kong-Sichuan Exchange Conference on Investment and Trade Co-operation. They witnessed the signing of a number of co-operation agreements between organisations from creative industries, higher education institutions, associations from different sectors and business enterprises, demonstrating that Hong Kong-Sichuan co-operation has passed beyond the traditional relationship in economic and trade areas and is heading towards multifaceted and comprehensive co-operation.

During the stay, Mrs Lam also visited an exhibition held by the Sichuan Provincial Government on the 40th anniversary of the reform and opening up, HK-Sichuan co-operation and 10th anniversary of Hong Kong's post-earthquake reconstruction support work in Sichuan. She also attended a ceremony in commemoration of the 10th anniversary of the massive Wenchuan earthquake organised by Sichuan Province in Wenchuan, and visited several universities in Sichuan which have academic projects with the universities in Hong Kong.

CE visits Huizhou and Guangzhou

The Chief Executive of HKSAR, Mrs Carrie Lam, visited two cities of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area, namely Huizhou and Guangzhou, on May 16 and 17.

Accompanied by the Director of the Chief Executive's Office, Mr Chan Kwok-ki, Mrs Lam met with the Acting Mayor of Huizhou, Mr Liu Ji. She said at the meeting that the HKSAR Government attaches great importance to the development of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area and expressed the hope that the two cities will explore

more collaboration in various industries in the future to seize together the opportunities brought about by the development of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area.

Mrs Lam continued the trip to Guangzhou with the Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs, Mr Patrick Nip, and Mr Chan. They had a meeting with Secretary of the CPC Guangzhou Municipal Committee, Mr Ren Xuefeng. With the opening of the Hong Kong section of the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link in September this year, Mrs Lam believed that the level of co-operation between the two places will be enhanced, allowing them to jointly promote the development of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area and helping Hong Kong better integrate into the overall development of the country. She also believed that the economy in various cities in the Bay Area will be boosted and people's livelihood will be improved.

Mrs Lam continued her visit to the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area on May 17 where she conducted visits to enterprises in relation to innovation and technology. She also met with Secretary of the CPC Guangdong Provincial Committee, Mr Li Xi, and the Governor of Guangdong Province, Mr Ma Xingrui. She expressed the hope that the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area would raise Hong Kong-Guangdong co-operation to a new stage.

Order on Comprehensive Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement with Saudi Arabia gazetted

An order made by the Chief Executive in Council under the Inland Revenue Ordinance (Cap. 112) to implement the Comprehensive Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement (CDTA) with Saudi Arabia was gazetted on May 18, 2018. The CDTA with Saudi Arabia ensures that investors will not have to pay tax twice on a single source of income. It will also bring tax savings and a greater certainty on taxation liabilities for investors from Saudi Arabia when they engage in trade and investment activities with Hong Kong and vice versa.

The 2018 Rural Representative Election voter registration campaign starts

The voter registration campaign for the 2018 Rural Representative Election (RRE) in Hong Kong was launched on May 14, 2018. The Home Affairs Department (HAD) appeals to all eligible persons who have not registered as electors and want to have their names on this year's register to submit their applications for voter registration by July 16, 2018.

There are three types of Rural Representatives, namely Indigenous Inhabitant Representatives, Resident Representatives and Kaifong Representatives. There are different eligibility requirements for registration as electors for these elections. Applicants should ascertain whether they fulfil the requirements.

The forms of "Application for New Voter Registration" and "Application for Change of Registered Particulars" can be obtained from the HAD, District Offices and government offices outside Hong Kong, or downloaded from the RRE website (www.had.gov.hk/rre).

Completed and signed forms should be forwarded in person or by post to the HAD or any District Office, by fax (fax number: +852 2591 6392) or email (rre@had.gov.hk) on or before the respective deadlines, Hong Kong time.
