"Hong Kong: Asia's World City" Roving Exhibition

The Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office (Toronto) (HKETO) continues to stage the roving exhibition called "Hong Kong: Asia's World City" in Oakville and Mississauga in the Greater Toronto Area during July and August. First launched in May, the exhibition aims to showcase to members of the Canadian public the achievements of Hong Kong in areas such as economic development, innovation and technology, transport and infrastructure, and arts and culture, as well as the beauty of its natural environment.

During the staging of the exhibition at Oakville Town Centre from July 30 to August 3, Director of HKETO, Miss Kathy Chan, took the opportunity to meet with the Mayor of the Town of Oakville, Mr Rob Burton, and updated him on Hong Kong's latest developments. After Oakville, the roving exhibition was staged at the Erin Mills Town Centre in Mississauga from August 8 to 14. Miss Chan took the chance to call on the Mayor of the City of Mississauga, Ms Bonnie Crombie, to exchange views on how to foster closer trade and economic relations between Hong Kong and Mississauga.

FS visited two cities of Guangdong-HK-Macao Bay Area

The Financial Secretary of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) government, Mr Paul Chan, visited two cities of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area, namely Shenzhen and Dongguan, between August 7 and 9.

During his visit to Shenzhen on August 7 and 8, Mr Chan called on senior officials of the Shenzhen Municipal Government, visited local innovation and technology companies, met with Hong Kong youths there and attended a dinner hosted by representatives of the Hong Kong business sector in Shenzhen.

On August 9, Mr Chan visited Dongguan to meet with senior officials and keep himself abreast of the latest developments in the high-tech industry in the city. During his stay, he visited Songshan Lake Xbot Park to learn about its work in entrepreneurial incubation in robotics and related fields as well as nurturing relevant talents. He also called on the Secretary of the CPC Dongguan Municipal Committee, Mr Liang Weidong, and the Mayor of the Dongguan Municipal Government, Mr Xiao Yafei, and had lunch with them. Mr Chan expressed the hope that Hong Kong and Dongguan can further collaborate in commercialisation of results of scientific and technological research, and join hands to promote the development of the Bay Area.

Director-General of Investment Promotion visits ASEAN to promote Hong Kong's role in Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area

The Director-General of Investment Promotion, Mr Stephen Phillips, embarked on visits to Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, and Bangkok, Thailand, on August 13 to promote the business opportunities Hong Kong has to offer in the context of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area development to Association of Southeast Asian Nations investors.

In Ho Chi Minh City, Mr Phillips participated in a roundtable discussion on business opportunities in Hong Kong relating to the Bay Area and the Belt and Road Initiative. This roundtable event was jointly organised by Invest Hong Kong and the Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry and supported by the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office in Singapore. The session highlighted to a group of targeted Vietnamese companies the latest economic trends and developments in Hong Kong and the ease of setting up a business in the city. It also shed light on cross-boundary initiatives that Hong Kong has undertaken to propel its economy and create greater opportunities for businesses.

In Bangkok, Mr Phillips met leaders in the real estate, retail and textiles sectors, as well as restaurant operators and service providers. He also talked to major local media on the benefits of entering the Hong Kong market for Thai businesses and promoted the upcoming StartmeupHK Festival and other trade exhibitions in Hong Kong.
