All travelers who are fully vaccinated can board a flight for Hong Kong. They must hold a negative result of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR)-based nucleic acid test taken within 48 hours before boarding as well as a confirmation of a room reservation at a designated quarantine hotel for at least seven nights. Pre-departure PCR-based nucleic acid tests are not required for travellers transferring or transiting in Hong Kong or inbound children aged below three.

## Beyond Borders art exhibition in Vancouver celebrates Hong Kong SAR 25th anniversary

#### Hong Kong ranked fifth in World Competitiveness Yearbook 2022

In the latest World Competitiveness Yearbook (WCY) 2022 published by the International Institute for Management Development (IMD), Hong Kong was ranked fifth globally, up from seventh last year. Denmark was ranked top, followed by Switzerland, Singapore and Sweden.



Among the four competitiveness factors in WCY 2022, Hong Kong continued to rank favourably in "Government efficiency" and "Business efficiency", and the rankings in "Economic performance" and "Infrastructure" also improved. As regards the sub-factors, Hong Kong continued to top the ranking in "Business legislation", and was amongst the top-three in "Public finance", "Tax policy" and "International investment".

A Government spokesperson said on June 15 that the IMD's WCY 2022 recognised Hong Kong as one of the most competitive economies in the world. Hong Kong's competitiveness is underpinned by the institutional strengths under "One Country, Two Systems".

#### Government extends existing social distancing measures

The Government announced on June 27 the gazettal of extension of existing social distancing measures in accordance with the public health emergency regulations under the Prevention and Control of Disease Ordinance, which will be effective from June 30 to July 13.

Currently, all catering and scheduled premises are allowed to re-open. The Government will continue to closely monitor the overall epidemic development, and take containment measures to sustain its effort in reducing the risk of an epidemic rebound.

In addition, the HKSAR Government announced on June 24 the immediate implementation of measures to curb scalping of guest rooms of designated quarantine hotels (DQHs) and the inclusion of three more DQH hotels under the eighth cycle of the DQH Scheme to increase the room supply.



The eighth cycle of DQH Scheme will run from August 1 to October 31. There are altogether 65 DQHs under the eighth cycle of DQH Scheme, providing around 24 000 rooms.

# Immigration Department introduces Online Assistance Request Form for residents outside Hong Kong to seek assistance

The Immigration Department (ImmD) of the HKSAR Government announced on June 21 the introduction of the Online Assistance Request Form service for Hong Kong residents outside Hong Kong to seek assistance from its Assistance to Hong Kong Residents Unit (AHU).

Further to the introduction of the network data call function for the AHU's 1868 hotline, the ImmD is now providing an Online Assistance Request Form to help Hong Kong residents in distress or in need of assistance outside Hong Kong to contact the AHU.



With the introduction of the new Online Assistance Request Form, Hong Kong residents in distress outside Hong Kong requiring assistance may use any one of the following means to contact the AHU:

#### Import of poultry meat and products from Township of Langley of British Columbia Province in Canada suspended

The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department of the HKSAR Government announced on June 21 that in view of a notification from the World Organisation for Animal Health about an outbreak of highly pathogenic H5N1 avian influenza in Township of Langley of British Columbia Province in Canada, the CFS has instructed the trade to suspend the import of poultry meat and products (including poultry eggs) from the area with immediate effect to protect public health in Hong Kong.

A CFS spokesman said that according to the Census and Statistics Department, Hong Kong imported about 4 tonnes of frozen poultry meat from Canada in the first three months of this year.
