In response to the local government's appeal for concerted efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19, the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office (Toronto) (HKETO) is closed temporarily. You may reach us via the following channels:

All travelers who are fully vaccinated can board a flight for Hong Kong. They must hold a negative result of a polymerase chain reaction (PCR)-based nucleic acid test taken within 48 hours before boarding. Pre-departure PCR-based nucleic acid tests are not required for travellers transferring or transiting in Hong Kong or inbound children aged below three.

All persons boarding flights to Hong Kong are required to complete the online electronic "Health & Quarantine Information Declaration" (<https://www.chp.gov.hk/hdf/>) and obtain a QR code in advance. The code is valid for 96 hours and should be presented at check-in for verification by the airlines.

In addition, all inbound travelers are subject to compulsory quarantine in designated quarantine hotels for three nights, followed by medical surveillance at home or in other self-arranged accommodation for four nights, with multiple tests during medical surveillance and the monitoring period thereafter. They are also subject to Amber Code restrictions under the Vaccine Pass during medical surveillance period, and not allowed to enter high-risk premises involving mask-off or group activities, as well as other premises requiring key protection.

### **Hong Kong once again ranked as the world's freest economy**

The Fraser Institute continued to rank Hong Kong as the world's freest economy in the Economic Freedom of the World 2022 Annual Report. Hong Kong has gained the top rank since the inception of the report. Among the five areas of assessment, Hong Kong continued to rank top in "Freedom to Trade Internationally" and "Regulation". The HKSAR Government welcomed the recognition.

A Government spokesman said that the HKSAR Government has been striving to improve the business environment and enhance market efficiency and support, thereby allowing the economy to display flexibility and resilience and leverage the advantages of the free market. The government's commitment to maintaining an efficient, free, open and fair business environment is once again affirmed.

Looking forward, Hong Kong, under "one country, two systems", will leverage on the motherland's strong support and connection with the world market, and continue to play its unique roles as a gateway, a springboard and an intermediary. Hong Kong will create strong impetus for growth, and actively integrate into the overall development of our country, dovetail with national strategies such as the National 14th Five-Year Plan, the Greater Bay Area development and high-quality Belt and Road co-operation, and seize the opportunities ahead.

## **Government maintains existing social distancing measures**

The HKSAR Government announced on September 20 the gazettal of the extension of existing social distancing measures in accordance with the public health emergency regulations under the Prevention and Control of Disease Ordinance. The measures will be effective from September 22 to October 5.

The number of daily new cases in Hong Kong has started to show signs of decline. It is now a critical time to stabilise the epidemic situation. To have a clear observation of the epidemic trend, the Government decided to maintain the existing social distancing measures in the next 14-day cycle.

Relevant measures include allowing all catering premises and scheduled premises to continue to operate subject to strict compliance with requirements. Other requirements, such as mask-wearing for citizens on transport carriers and in specified public places, as well as prohibition of group gatherings in public places, also remain in force.

In addition, the HKSAR Government announced on September 9 that in view of the gradual removal of COVID-19 prevention and control requirements in overseas places, outbound passengers and transit passengers departing for overseas places or Taiwan via the Hong Kong International Airport are no longer required to go through temperature screening. As for inbound passengers entering Hong Kong, as well as departing passengers bound for the Mainland or Macao, the temperature screening arrangements remain in place.

Besides, in view of the latest developments of the epidemic situation, and after reviewing the relevant data, the Government announced on September 9 the adjustments to the quarantine arrangements for air crew. Locally based air crew performing duties on passenger flights to/from overseas places or Taiwan are required to undergo a “test and hold” arrangement upon their arrival at Hong Kong International Airport. They may leave the airport after obtaining a negative result of the nucleic acid test. They are subject to regular testing after their return to the local community, so as to keep their health conditions under continued monitoring.

The Government trusts that the adjustments will effectively facilitate airlines to enhance flight services between Hong Kong and other parts of the world, and enable Hong Kong to play its role as an international aviation hub for bringing convenience to travellers and businesses, and facilitating recovery of normal economic and social activities.

### **SCED attends 6th ASEAN Economic Ministers - Hong Kong, China Consultation**

The Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development of the HKSAR, Mr Algernon Yau, and the Minister of Commerce of Cambodia, Mr Pan Sorasak, co-chaired the 6th Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Economic Ministers - Hong Kong, China Consultation in Siem Reap, Cambodia, on September 17 to discuss issues relating to the implementation of the Free Trade Agreement and the Investment Agreement between Hong Kong and ASEAN.

Mr Yau said at the meeting that the conclusion of the two Agreements is a strategic move in unlocking huge economic potential and injecting new impetus for the long-term and sustainable trade and economic development between the two places. ASEAN is Hong Kong's second largest partner in trade in goods and third largest partner in trade in services.

Mr Yau also appealed for ASEAN member states' continued support for Hong Kong's early accession to the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP). ASEAN member states welcomed Hong Kong's request and readiness for the launch of substantive accession discussions between RCEP Members and Hong Kong.

### **Import of poultry meat and products from Sturgeon County of Alberta Province in Canada suspended**

The Centre for Food Safety (CFS) of the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department of the HKSAR Government announced on September 9 and 19 respectively that in view of a notification from the World Organisation for Animal Health about outbreaks of highly pathogenic H5N1 avian influenza in Sturgeon County and Strathcona County of Alberta Province in Canada, the CFS has instructed the trade to suspend the import of poultry meat and products (including poultry eggs) from the affected areas with immediate effect to protect public health in Hong Kong.

A CFS spokesman said that according to the Census and Statistics Department, Hong Kong imported about 60 tonnes of frozen poultry meat from Canada in the first six months of this year.

### **Limited registration approved for non-locally trained doctors**

The Hospital Authority (HA) spokesperson on September 7 announced that confirmation has been received from the Medical Council of Hong Kong on the approval of three applications of non-locally trained doctors for practice with limited registration in public

hospitals to help relieve the frontline workload. Among the three applications, two are new applications while the other one is for renewal. The three doctors will be serving in internal medicine, ophthalmology and radiology departments.

The HA spokesperson said that the recruitment of non-locally trained doctors will continue. Selection interviews by user departments will be arranged for eligible applicants. Currently, there are 44 non-locally trained doctors working in public hospitals under limited registration, to relieve the manpower shortage and workload pressure of frontline doctors in the specialties of anaesthesia, cardiothoracic surgery, emergency medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, neurosurgery, obstetrics and gynaecology, ophthalmology, paediatrics, radiology and surgery.

### **Recruitment for four civil service graduate grades**

The HKSAR Government launched a recruitment exercise on September 17 for appointment as Administrative Officer (AO), Executive Officer II, Assistant Trade Officer II and Transport Officer II in 2022-23.

The application period for the above posts closes at 5pm on October 7 (Hong Kong time). The recruitment is open to all permanent residents of the HKSAR who meet the relevant entry requirements. Current final year undergraduates may also apply.

As part of the entry requirements, applicants for these posts will need to have obtained:

- (a) Level 2 in the two language papers (Use of Chinese and Use of English) in the Common Recruitment Examination (CRE), or equivalent;
- (b) a pass result in the Aptitude Test paper in the CRE; and
- (c) a pass result in the Basic Law and National Security Law Test (BLNST) (degree/professional grades).
