New Capital Investment Entrant Scheme attracts strong response in first month

InvestHK announced on April 9 that the New Capital Investment Entrant Scheme (the Scheme) has seen good response since its launch on March 1, recording double-digit applications and over 1 600 enquiries mainly by professional service providers. This reflects the strong confidence from high-net-worth individuals in Hong Kong.

The Director-General of Investment Promotion, Ms Alpha Lau, said that the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Government will continue to roll out measures to further enhance Hong Kong's competitiveness as an asset and wealth management hub and hence the attractiveness of the Scheme. InvestHK will also actively promote the Scheme to various business associations, international stakeholders, family offices, and professional service providers in addressing enquiries and ensuring clarity.

Under the Scheme, an eligible applicant must make an investment of a minimum of HK\$30 million in the permissible investment assets. A successful applicant may bring dependents (including spouse and unmarried dependent children aged under 18) to Hong Kong. Permission to stay will normally be granted to them for two years. Upon expiry of the two-year period, they may apply for an extension.

Hong Kong Observatory supports global meteorological co-operation

The Hong Kong Observatory (HKO) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) updated a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on March 28 to further strengthen meteorological co-operation.

The HKO and the WMO first signed the MOU in October 2018 to support global weather information services. Under the updated MOU, the HKO will continue to develop and operate two WMO global weather information websites which are core components of the WMO Global Multi-hazard Alert System framework for increasing the availability of authoritative warnings and information related to extreme and potentially high-impact weather, water, and climate events to contribute to the implementation of the United Nations Early Warnings for All initiative.

Moreover, the HKO will strongly support the WMO Voluntary Cooperation Programme by providing a variety of meteorological training courses to WMO members through the Meteorological Training Centre for Belt and Road Countries.

Policy on change of sex entry on Hong Kong identity card revised

The HKSAR Government announced on April 3 that the policy on change of sex entry on Hong Kong identity card (the Policy) has been revised. With effect immediately, in addition to persons who have completed full sex reassignment surgery (SRS), generally, if persons who have not completed full SRS have completed the specified surgical treatment for the purpose of modifying sexual characteristics and satisfied the revised criteria and requirements, they may apply for a change of sex entry on their Hong Kong identity cards.

A spokesperson for the HKSAR Government said that the revision concerns the policy on change of sex entry of Hong Kong identity card only, and such entry does not represent the holder's sex as a matter of law. It does not affect any other policies of the Government or the handling of any other gender-related matters under the law in Hong Kong or relevant legal procedures.
